- 7. Naloxone temporarily reverses an opioid overdose and you can get it for free at most pharmacies in Canada.
- 8. If you witness an overdose, **call 911, stay and** give naloxone if you have it.
- 9. Even if you have taken drugs or have some on you, the **Good Samaritan Drug Overdose Act** provides some legal protection if you stay and call 911.
- 10. **Stigma** prevents people from getting help—addiction is not a choice.
